

"A. LINCOLN & SON" Autographed Photographs

Small carte-devisite photographs signed by Abraham Lincoln are scarce, but large cabinet size photographs bearing the autograph of the sixteenth president extremely However, are rare. another auto-graphed, half-length oval photo-(Meserve graph No. 39) has been discovered bearing the inscrip-tion "A. Lincoln & Son." As the inscription would indicate this is the famous photograph of Lincoln and Tad, taken by Mathew B. Brady in his Washington studio on February 9, 1864.

This photograph is one of two secured by Lin-coln's "fourth" private secretary Gustave E. Matile. This twentyfive year old Department of Interior employee became an under secretary to John Hay in 1864 and "in a way . . . became secretary to president Lin-coln." Matile was responsible for securing two autographed photographs of Lincoln and Tad.

The newly discovered photograph was presented by Matile to his good friend M. Gormly with the following letter:

Allow me present you with one of the two likenesses given me by our late dear President, Lincoln. Knowing that you will ap-preciate the gift for itself as well as for its coming from your friend Matile. I know that I cannot dispose of it more satisfactorily to myself than by giving it to one whom I know to have been an admirer of the many good qualities and noble heart of our late President, only second to George Washing-

The signature at the bottom was written by his own hand as he gave it to me.

The other photograph is not for sale. The other photograph, first published in the Autumn 1956 issue of the Journal of the Illinois State Historical Society, mentioned by Matile in his letter to Gormly is the property of the Kellogg Public Library of Green Bay, Wisconsin. It is almost identical to the one in Whitefish, Montana. The presentation card in the photograph states that it was secured "When . . . Matile was under-secretary to John Hay, Lincoln's secretary." In later years Matile was a United States Court Commissioner and was called "Judge." His legal work pertained largely to the Oneida Indian Reservation in Wisconsin. He died June 17, 1908, in Green Bay and is buried in the Woodlawn Cemetery.

Four other autographs of Abraham Lincoln in the large cabinet size are known to be extant. A half-size oval photograph (Meserve No. 6) inscribed "Yours truly A. Lincoln" sold at the Parke-Bernet Gallery in 1952 for \$550. It is now the property of Dr. Paul B. Freeland of Nashville, Tennessee. Another contemporary, half-length, oval photograph (Meserve No. 9) signed by the future president "Yours truly A. Lincoln" sold at the same gallery in 1952 for \$750. Originally this photograph was inscribed by Lincoln for Arnold Robinson, a crier of the United States Court in Springfield, Illinois. Both of the above mentioned photographs were once the property of the late Oliver R. Barrett, whose great collection of Lincolniana was sold in New York at public auction.

Undoubtedly the finest half-length, oval, autographed Lincoln photograph (Meserve No. 42) bears the inscription "For Mrs. Lucy G. Speed, from whose pious hands I accepted the present of an Oxford Bible twenty years ago. Washington, D. C. October 3, 1861. A. Lincoln." This photograph is the property of the J. B. Speed Memorial Museum at Louisville, Kentucky.

Another autographed, half-length oval photograph of Lincoln (Meserve No. 14) is the property of the Illinois State Historical Library of Springfield, Illinois, It was originally inscribed "Yours truly A. Lincoln" for George F. Smith of Plantsville, Connecticut. Smith was a drygoods salesman who secured Lincoln's autographed photograph four days before the 1860 presidential election.

Fort Wayne, Indiana—1860

"When Stephen A. Douglas came to Fort Wayne, October 2, 1860, in his canvass against the 'Railsplitter of the Sangamon', a huge sawlog intended to represent Abraham Lincoln was flung into the St. Marys River. Only one protest against the political float was made, however. When the float challenging the 'Black Republicans' halted before the house of a rabid abolitionist, his wife came out on the porch 'most unwisely . . . and with angry words raised her fist against this provocation'.

"At sunset there was a hue and cry, 'Everybody to the Court House'. This time a straw figure of Abraham Lincoln was hanged in effigy.

"... Allen County ... cast 3,224 votes for Douglas, 2,522 for Lincoln, 42 for Breckinridge, 32 for Bell."


