
Lincolniana Auction Prices – 1914 Part II


The total sale of the Major William H. Lambert collection amounted to \$213,026.30. This figure is based on a penciled notation in a sale catalogue in the Foundation's collection. This amount, of course, includes the 1384 items of Thackerayana. 


