SOURCE MATERIAL FOR LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY

Nearly every organized group which convenes in February plans a Lincoln or Washington meeting, at which time some one is invited to speak about one of these outstanding American characters.

The chief difficulty confronting those who would address such gatherings is finding something about Lincoln which has not been worn threadbare by constant using. While Lincoln Lore may not achieve a high standard of literary excellence, it does attempt to present data which it is difficult to find in most of the standard works on Lincoln.

This number is prepared with the object in view of assisting those who have a file of Lincoln Lore, to assemble their data so that it may be used as source material for a Lincoln address or program.

Aside from the subjects suggested here, one may turn to the issue of January 11, 1932, and find another series of outlines which might suggest other topics of interest. The reading time of Lincoln Lore is about seven minutes. This allows one using these bulletins to estimate quite accurately the time to be consumed by the reading of one or a series of the bulletins.
